#### PROGRAMME OF WORK AND BUDGET 2017 - 2018

#### Introduction

Attached as Annex 1 is the proposed Program of Work (POW) of the Tehran Convention for 2017-2018.

The activities listed in the POW are building on the implementation of the decisions taken at the 5<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Tehran Convention, Ashgabat, 30 May 2014 (COP5) and the consultations and recommendations of the Preparatory Committee meetings for COP6.

Annex 1 includes information on the proposed sources and modalities of funding, while Annex 2 details the composition of the Secretariat and its cost as far as they will have to be charged to the Trust Fund of the Convention.

The overall cost of the POW is \$ 1,155.000 and equal to the budget of the Trust Fund of the Convention contained in Annex II of document TC/COP6/7, after deduction of the 13% program support cost which UNEP will charge.

Not reflected in the budget of the POW is the understanding and commitment of UNEP to re-invest 67% of its overhead charge (up to \$ 150,150) to directly support the functioning of the Secretariat (see footnote in Annex 2).

The POW as presented in Annex 1 and Annex 2 can be considered as a bare minimum, which nevertheless will have eaten all financial reserves by the end of the biennium. Resource mobilization should therefore be high on the agenda of COP6.

### The Conference of the Parties may wish to:

• Approve the Program of Work and Note the proposed budget of the Tehran Convention for 2017-2018;

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• Appeal to UNEP and other potential donors to cooperate and support the implementation of the POW financially

• Consider and decide how to further increase the financial resources for the Convention process
